For the benefit of the new members, the Chairman informed about the grant of Autonomous status to Jerusalem College of Engineering in 2019 by UGC for a period of 10 years. He also informed that statutory bodies such as Board of Studies, Academic Council & Governing Council were formed with nominees from Anna University, Industry and Academia. Based on the recommendations and suggestions received from these bodies, the college has successfully implemented the curriculum and syllabi for three academic years. The first batch under the autonomous structure is in the final year now.

The Chairman highlighted the following salient achievements of the college during the academic year 2021-22.

- Three year extension of NBA accreditation for the 2 UG Programmes (B.E - BME & CSE) with effect from June 2022
- Extension of NAAC accreditation with "A" grade upto December 2024.
- Ranked in the Silver Band with B++ Grade in the OBE Ranking 2022 and is positioned as "The Premier Institution for Academic Excellence" in India.
- The percentage of placements for the Academic year 2021-22 so far is 92.24%
